The business category of the recipient dates back to 1886, and last year celebrated 125 years of service to Alexander County. Back in those early days, it was very important not to miss your printing deadline as the primitive press did infact run on electricity; however, if the job were not completed prior to nightfall, there was not enough electricity to run the press when local residents turned on their lights for the night.

Today, the recipient is a modern, midweek publication, bringing local news, entertainment news, sports, advertising and photographs to its readers. In addition publishing a community hometown paper, the recipient also publishes The Bethlehem Star and prints several other publications including high school newspapers and a special literacy publication produced monthly for

kindergarten through fifth grade students, Kid Scoop News.

As a progressive local news provider, the recipient launched its first web site in 1997 offering highlights from the printed edition. In 2009, they published their first online edition for their subscribers and continue to utilize their web site to publish breaking news for residents between the publishing window for the print edition.

Over the decades, the recipient has continued to improve and advance their news publishing capabilities for the benefit of its readers and the community.
